### **Curriculum Levels**


We are required to provide two updates about your child's achievement for the end of the year. Here's a graph to show

you the curriculum levels in the current NZ curriculum. As you can see, most of our tamariki fall into the first 3 to 4 levels. This is reflected in how we have reported your child's current achievement level for the end of 2024

# Years and Curriculum Levels

This diagram shows how curriculum levels typically relate to years at school. Many students do not, however, fit this pattern. They include those with special learning needs, those who are gifted, and those who come from non-English-speaking backgrounds. Students tearning an additional language are also unlikely to follow the suggested progression: level 1 is the entry level for those with no prior knowledge of the language being learned, regardless of their school year.

As you can see from this example, this child is currently working at the expected end-of-year level for Mathematics, which for this child is the beginning of level 2 of the curriculum. They are working above the expected level for reading and writing. You will also see a level called "Pre" this means "Pre Level 1": and relates to children who are working below the primary school level. For Year 0 students there is only a "end of year" expectation as they started school after the middle of the year. For any further clarification please contact your child's teacher.

## Reading, Writing and Maths Comments

These comments are shared to expand on the progress made in these areas as well as identify some next steps for your child to work on in 2025

#### L.E.A.R.N Values - Student Comment/ Reflection

This section is an opportunity for your child to reflect on how they have shown our L.E.A.R.N values at school. You'll find these comments to be less formal as they have been co-constructed or written by our tamariki themselves. This will be the final time we use the L.E.A.R.N values as next year we will be embedding our M.A.N.A values.

#### **General Comment**

These comments are written by our teachers and cover aspects like behaviour, curriculum progress in areas like P.E, Art, Inquiry, Te Reo Māori as well as the next steps for the remainder of the year. You'll also find more personalised comments from the teacher's observations and connections with your child.
